Aunt Lena or as we would have said, "Aunt Leenee", was the wife of Grandpa Hoffman's brother, Julius. Uncle Julius had died and left her with eight children. I don't know how old the children were at the time of his death, but I know Mom always referred to the six daughters as Uncle Julius' girls. Only three of the girls married. The other three became nurses and worked in a hospital in St. Louis. Mom said that Aunt Lena loved to look after people who were sick. I remember Aunt Lena as a somewhat dreary person. When she came to visit, she and Mom always wound up sitting in the parlor with Aunt Lena telling stories about serious illnesses and death. And they would both be crying. Mom said that Aunt Lena would do the same thing when Mom's mother was alive. Mom said that Aunt Lena's daughters would send one of them sneaking to the parlor door to listen. When she returned, they would always ask, "Are they crying yet?" Mom said that when they were kids, they were all roaming around in the surrounding territory, and one of the older girls began telling them about a crayhound. She said it could kill a man as big as her papa. Soon she thought she heard something, and thought it was a crayhound. They all became somewhat alarmed and began heading home. Mom said that when they got home Aunt Lena and her mother (Marie Engleman) asked what had them so frightened, and they said they had seen a Crayhound. They were all very good and kind people. They were just quite dramatic.

Helena Johana, daughter of Fred and Marie Engleman was born July 7, 1860 in a small province in Germany. At the tender age of 2 years, her parents emigrated to the fair shores of the United States to make their future home and joined the ranks of Pioneers who told diligently and unceasingly in the construction of our present great nation. Early in her youth she sought and found her Savior and professed faith in Him and it was in Him that she placed her faith and through trials and tribulations she relied on Him who when the grim reaper destined that her earthly cares were concluded, took her from her labor to her reward in the "Land of Endless Day." Aunt Lena, as she was well-known to all who knew her, was not only a kind and affectionate mother but many deeds of her kindness were rendered in many homes in the community where she spent her entire life. Her helping hands were often relied upon especially in the hours of afflictions and death. Her Christian Life was truly characteristic of the principals of a true and devoted Christian life and this was evidence by the active part taken by her in her duties as a member of

the German Baptist Church of which she was a large member. Following a brief illness early on the morning of May, 1941, and only three weeks following the summons of her oldest daughter Alma. Aunt Lena too answered the inevitable call that we all must answer. Her passing was exemplary of one who is ready and willing to meet their creator and thus terminated a career that may justifiably be termed an irreparable loss. Mourning her departure are 4 surviving daughters, Eleanor and Ella of St. Louis, Mo., Mrs. Julia Prater of Fillmore, and Lula of Bayle City; 2 sons Victor of St. Louis and Harold of Springfield. Her husband, daughter Mable having preceded her some years ago. She also leaves five grandsons, Oscar and Rupert Eller, Warren and Hadley Hoffman and Howard Prater and one granddaughter Carol Hoffman; two great granddaughters, Mabel Imogene and Janet Illene Eller; one sister Mrs. Anna Hoffman of Marinette, Wisconsin and one brother, Rev. George Engleman of Chicago, together with a host of other relatives and friends.

A precious one from us has gone. A voice we have loved is stilled, although the body slumbers here, the soul is safe in heaven.

Funeral services were largely attended at both the house and at the German Baptist Church Friday afternoon. A prayer at the home was offered by Elder D.E. Baker of Charleston, an old friend of the family. At the church, services were in charge of Eld. Lee Lawlor and Eld. Charles Cearlock. The singers were Mrs. Waverly Strobel and Mrs. Nova Harris of Ramsey with Mrs. Burr Lane of Fillmore at piano. Last rites and burial was in Hoffman Cemetery. The casket bearers were George and Harry Thompson, Maurice Toberman, Gusta Walstrom, Nova Brown, and Raymond Hoffman. The flower girls were Della, Mary, and Myrtle Walstrom, Mrs. Grove O'Dell, Marcelia Wollerman, Delisa Hoyle and Melbourine and Reta Rhodes. The floral offerings were many and most beautiful.

Juanita Pope's Information:

Son of August and Caroline, Julius decided he wanted to have a middle name and chose Caesar. He thought it was spelled with an "S." He married Helena Englemann on April 16, 1883. Most folks called them Uncle Julius an Aunt Leany. They moved in next to August and Caroline across the road (south) from Washington School. The house that Julius built is still standing, owned by the Sanders family. All of Julius and Helena's children were born here and also one grandson, Oscar Eller, Alma's son. Julius was a kind of "jack-of-all-trades" and at one time had a Huckster Wagon, went to Kansas to work in the wheat fields and pulled my grand pa's teeth. His store was failing because people weren't paying their bills. Nearly everyone bought on credit those days and when appointed agent for the Toledo, St. Louis and Western Railroad, he closed the store. He was a very gentle, quiet man and Aunt Lena controlled the family.

Julius fell and broke his arm while painting a barn, May 19, 1902.

Julius S. Hoffman, son of August and Caroline Hoffman, born near Vera, Illinois, March 16, 1862 departed this life at his home in Bayle City, Illinois, March 13, 1922 aged 59 years, IL months and 26 days. He was united in marriage with Lena Engleman in 1883 to which union nine children were born, three sons and six daughters. One son died in infancy, while the others, together with the sorrowing companion are left to mourn their loss. Mrs. Robert Eller, the oldest daughter resides south of Bayle, Mabel, Elenora, Julia, Ella and Victor reside in St. Louis in which they have splendid positions, while Harold and Lula reside at home. Mr. Hoffman professed faith in Christ early in life and united with the German Baptist Church to which he remained faithful to the end. For years he was engaged in the mercantile business at Bayle and for a number of years for the I., St. L. & W (later the Nickel plate railroad) there. He applied his Christianity in all his business dealings being strictly upright and honorable, being kind to the just, forgiving those trespassing against him, a fond and indulgent father, a good companion and a kind neighbor, thus leaving to us the sure evidence of that work of Grace thus causing him to live at this time....where peace and happiness will ever reign. Just prior to his death he requested the song, "There will be no more sorrow when Jesus comes" and with eyes turned heavenward he said he was only "going home." Besides his immediate family, he leaves two brothers, Henry and William, besides many other relatives and friends to mourn his departure. funeral services were held at the German Baptist Church conducted by Eld. J. F. Virden assisted by Eld. Newt Grigg after which the interment was made in the Hoffman Cemetery nearby.

Mabel was the daughter of Julius and Helena. Mabel attended Washington School, being taught in both German and English. She was the first of the family to leave home when she moved to St. Louis around 1910 to enter nurses training at the old St. Louis Baptist Hospital, 20th & Franklin. she graduated in 1912 and served as a city nurse in the colored district. She later did private duty in hospitals and homes in the St. Louis area. Mabel never married. She loved soap operas and radio shows, especially Amos and Andy. She was a very kind and tolerant person, who lacked the sharp tongue of some of the rest of the family. She died at age fifty-one of kidney complications, the first of her family to die. Her mother and sisters mourned Mabel's death as long as they lived and she was mentioned often the "saint" of the family?

Mabel Caroline Hoffman, second oldest daughter of Julius and Lena Hoffman was born near Bayle City, Illinois, Sept. 19, 1886. She received her grade education in the Washington School. At the age of sixteen years, she professed faith in her Redeemer of the world and upon this profession was baptized by Rev. Forkel and joined the German Baptist Church of Shafter township. In 1911, she transferred her membership to the St. Louis Park Baptist Church of St. Louis, Mo. During the month of January of 1910, Mabel entered nurses training in the St. Louis Hospital completing her course in three years and graduated from that institution with highest honors. Following the completion of her training, she devoted her entire life to her profession and winning the admiration of the entire medical profession and various hospital staffs where she served faithfully without thought of self, always ready to endure physical suffering so that those entrusted to her care would be relieved of all unnecessary suffering. During the month of March 1937, her health demanded that she must retire from active duty and since that time had been a constant sufferer and for many weeks suffered intensely, but through all her suffering, she always lifted her eyes to the of Calvary's Rugged Brow for she knew that from there came her comfort and consolation. Many times during her suffering, she requested that her loved ones sing the hymns she loved so well. In the evening of Sept. 8, 1937, the Angel of Death came swiftly to her bedside and carried her away from suffering to that fair land where we are told "the streets are paved with gold and where sorrows and parting are not known." She leaves to mourn her departure, her aged mother, five sisters, Mrs. Robert Eller of Bayle City, Mrs. Julia Prater of Fillmore, Eleanora and Ella G. of St. Louis and Lula at home. Two brothers, Victor of St. Louis, Mo. and Harold of Springfield, Illinois. Five nephews, Oscar and Rupert Eller, Warren and Hadley Hoffman and Howard Prater.

One niece, Carol Hoffman and one great niece, Mabel Imogene Eller. Her father and one brother preceded her to the G lory World. She also leaves three uncles, Rev. George Engleman of Chic ago, Illinois, Henry Hoffman of Shafter township and William Hoffman of Hagarstown, Illinois and one aunt, Mrs. Anna Hoffman of Marinette, Wisconsin. The cause of her death was uremic complications. Funeral services were conducted at the German Baptist Church in Shafter township at 2 P.M., Saturday, Sept. 11th. Rev. I.I. Gubelman of St. Louis and Rev. Lee Lawler of Vera officiating. Interment was in the German Baptist Cemetery. Active pallbearers were George Thompson, Edwin Moore, Franklin Moore, Charles McClure, Maurice Oberman and Nova Walstrom. Honorary pallbearers were Clifford, Leonard, Fred and Clarence Hoffman. Music was furnished by a male quartette of St. Louis. Large and magnificent floral offerings were proof of the high esteem in which Mabel was held by her many friends. Ella was the fifth child of Julius and Helena. she had protruding front teeth and was the least attractive of the children. She was an extremely intelligent person and was certified as a grade school teacher at age nineteen. She also became a telegrapher and stenographer and in 1932 at age 37, graduated from Central Hospital in St. Louis as a nurse. She was proud of her education. Ella never married. She loved sports (especially the St. Louis Cardinals), soap operas, radio and movies. She wrote letters giving her opinions to broadcasters and often received written or onthe-air responses. Ella and Eleanora continued to live in Uncle Julius' house in Bayle City after their mother died, taking turns going to St. Louis to work as nurses. They would go for about two weeks and come back to Bayle for about two weeks. I really liked "the girls", but they were very sharp tongued and at times very sarcastic, especially Ella. When her sister, Lula married Bill Pilger, Ella was not happy. Ella felt that her sister Julia's son, Howard was too sympathetic to

Lula. Howard was in the Navy and out to sea when he received a letter from Ella addressed to "Dear Deceitful Nephew" and harangued him about siding with Lula. He stopped reading and sailed the letter over the rail of the ship and out to sea. I lived with the girls (Ella and Eleanora) in Bayle City during my last three years of high school, so that I could attend Ramsey High School. One day, my mother came to help wallpaper and clean. Their sister Lula had also come to spend the day. As we sat down to eat lunch, Lula and m other, and I think Eleanora was in on it too, got tickled over some little something and started laughing. Ella pulled herself up to her full height, withered us all with her look and said, "Well, we just won't pray." So, we ate lunch without the blessing.
